Action Alert: The People's Postcards

Last month, Bend area leaders spent a Saturday writing and sending postcards to our legislators to advocate for our Agenda of Belonging. If you are printing and sending off you own, there are of simple rules to know when contacting your representative in order to ensure your letter makes it past the mail room volunteers.

- Always send your letter to <u>your</u> representative
- State the town you live in and that you are a constituent
- · Explain why this issue matters to you
- Leave a method of contact (sometimes the representative will want to contact you back, and they need a way to do so)
- Don't forget to include your name

Send Postcards to Salem!

It's a fun, easy and effective way to make our voices count!

What: Let's send 1000 postcards to Oregon's Joint Ways & Means Committee members, urging them to support a Belonging Agenda this legislative session.

When: Throughout the month of May 2025.

Why: The Joint Ways & Means Committee makes critical decisions about which bills will make it to the next stage of the legislative process. Committee members need to

hear from everyday Oregonians about why Oregon's legislature should align its budget with a core value and horizon: an Oregon where all belong.

You might also print out a handful of reference sheets so people can easily find the priority bills as they're filling out their postcards.

How: What do I do?

PRINT postcards. Pick up cards from the entry hall or the church office. Or print your own!

GATHER with people and fill them out Bring postcards to a place where people in your life who care about building an Oregon where all belong are already gathering.

Encourage people to write about how these bills connect with their own values and personal stories.


> **Bonus:** Take a photo of your group at work!

Celebrate! **EMAIL** a message to: admin@togetherlab.org. Let us know how many postcards you mailed and to whom.



TESTIMONIES, NOT TESTS OF THE FAITH

The United Church of Christ embraces a theological heritage that affirms the Bible as the authoritative witness to the Word of God, the creeds of the ecumenical councils, and the confessions of the Reformation. The UCC has roots in the "covenantal" tradition—meaning there is no centralized authority or hierarchy that can impose any doctrine or form of worship on its members.
