# Pastor's Annual Report

Dear Parkrose Community United UCC,

It has been quite a year! You wrapped up a substantial interim ministry with Rev. Dianne Rodriguez—please read her report for those details as well as her warm remarks. I officially began my call in partnership with you in September. This report will mostly be regarding our quarter together at the end of 2023, as well as where I anticipate we're heading for 2024.

We started our time together by making space to harvest the leadings our church was sensing. As we've started this pastor/congregation relationship together, it has been important to me that every voice be heard and, where general agreement can be reached, feedback be implemented. The topics that came up could be bunched together into the following themes: worship, growth, healing, friendship, and community partnership. Each topic was given its own week for more specific congregational discernment. The results have been overwhelmingly positive. Worship is more representative and holistic; growth is being experienced spiritually and more folks are also checking us out; points of woundedness, both communal and personal, are healing; new friendships are being knit together and old friendships are being reknit; longstanding community partnerships are being sustained and new ones are being explored.

All of this supports the mission and vision of our church—two very important things that drew me to consider this relationship to begin with. Our mission is to love God, one another, and our neighbors as ourselves. Our vision for accomplishing this work is by compassionately serving the wider community, courageously practicing peace and justice, enthusiastically



inviting and welcoming everyone, and faithfully worshipping as community to deepen our spirituality.

My hopes for 2024 are that we further this work and our commitment to it. I also anticipate that such work will, in cooperation with our neighbors and the Divine, lead us towards more. This is a call that, when attended to, leads us further and deeper into our connections with one another, ourselves, and the heart of God. Speaking of connections, I hope that 2024 is the year of intentional relationship. What I mean is that we do everything as relationally as possible, and we create relational spaces that (for so many of us) have been lost since the isolation of COVID. I also mean that each one of us makes space for each other and our neighbors by investing in one another beyond church: inviting one another to coffee, going out to dinner, checking in on one another, etc.

My friends, I am so grateful for this church, our community, and each one of you. May we grow as companions and collaborators to one another and our neighbors, as best as we have capacity.

# Interim Pastor's Annual Report



Greetings everyone,

Several weeks ago I was pleased when Clay asked me if I wanted to submit a 2023 annual report. As I shared with Clay the year of the transition team and

search committee completing their work, was and is, the culmination of such faithful passionate work at Parkrose Community UCC, it surely needs to be commemorated in writing.

# At the end of July, I sent the following email:

It is so wonderful to be able to announce that Parkrose will be led in service this Sunday, July 23 by the candidate who has been chosen by the Search Committee to be your next settled pastor. Many thanks for the outstanding job the Search Committee has done! Please know that this means the work of the Search Committee is complete. Henceforth, if you should have any questions and/or concerns about how Parkrose is now moving forward, please address them to the Pastor Support Team.

This is a brief summary of who the PST are, what they do, and why they do it. The Parkrose PST (Pastor Support Team) and Pastor Dianne Rodriguez all did the Pastoral Support Team Training via Zoom. This was training from the MESA team who shared: "These are changing times for the church, and the name change from the Pastor Parish Relations Committee to the Pastoral Support Team was born out of the need to navigate change, because we can no longer rely on the status quo. The Pastoral Support Team is intended to not only support the pastor, but also to strengthen the mutual covenant/ministry between the pastor and congregation. It eliminates triangulation between the pastor, PPRC, and the congregation. This change will help build trust, consistency, honesty, openness, transparency, and togetherness."

It was the end of so much faithful discernment and yet the birth of new life and possibilities with Pastor Giuseppe.

I am so blessed to have been a part of your transition time, envisioning your future, doing ministry with the community, especially the Parkrose micro-village/and partners and helping you make your transition to calling your settled pastor. It was exhausting, hard work — thank you everyone. I leave you with the words from my farewell message this past August:

Sometimes maybe most of the time; I experience glimmers of God and things of heaven in nature or art such as dancing, poetry, and song. In the innocence of children, in relationships of honesty, and in communities where collectively we experience "home." In all honesty when I accepted the call to be your intentional interim pastor, I had come to a place of feeling frustrated in church. As a spiritual director I was seeking to walk with a community that experienced God authentically in all the blessed messiness of life. I was starting to

resolve myself to the possibility that church was only capable of being a bunch of really nice folks, doing good works, learning and talking about The God of Jesus Christ.

This past week I reflected back upon my last words with my dear colleague Don as he gave me his keys to Parkrose, I remember him saying to me, "now I believe I can retire with ease knowing that Parkrose will be taken where God is leading them." In the midst of the pandemic, it was simply my prayer to help the church survive, work with the transition team and be on to another call. Never in a million years could I imagine that Parkrose would be taking me where God was leading me. Today as Jesus and the disciples are journeying to Jerusalem, knowing it is his end days, He asks the disciples who people say he is, and who they say he is. Peter blurts out you are the Messiah the son of the living God. On many occasions to help church understand the Hebrew essence of the word Messiah I tell a story.

There once was a community of Jesus followers. Their spiritual leader had become despondent. The community had started to dwindle in numbers and spirit. They had even become alienated to the neighborhood around them. In despair the spiritual leader went to visit her Rabbi friend, telling him of the community hardship she was encountering. The Rabbi hugged her and said, "I have a secret to tell you, The Messiah is one of you. Now go back and look at your community knowing the Messiah is one of you."

The spiritual leader returned to her community. She gazed at each and every person wondering if Amy was the Messiah or was it Erik or possibly Joanna? As her despondency began to lift and her hope



evident, the people experienced the shift, and they asked what had happened. She shared I am looking for the Messiah who is one of us. Soon everyone looked at one another and their neighbors wondering if those they encountered were the Messiah. In their search for the Messiah in each other and their neighbors the community once again flourished.

When the Jewish people were looking for a Messiah, they were not looking for a savior that would get them to heaven. Their hope was in establishing justice, a compassionate, and safe world here on earth, one where each person could experience home. My dearest friends, thank you for these past three years that have restored my faith and hope, in experiencing the home of Heaven Here on Earth. I don't believe it is a coincidence that when asked when renewing my pastoral profile if I had any last words of a song or poem that defined my

ministerial work at this point in time, they were those of Tracey Chapman's song, "Heaven's Here on Earth." Words that came to life for me here at Parkrose.

Despite challenges posed by COVID variants (still), our community was able to carry out good work this past year with the continuous support of our dedicated volunteers, pastoral leaders, staff, and congregation. Thanks to everyone's efforts, the programs remained without interruptions. We appreciate your support!

Youth, Sunday School & Fellowship: Here is general information about the make-up of the young people at Parkrose UCC. Please note: While Sunday school enjoys a few visitors, we have a very small and committed core group that attends each Sunday.



Alas, I could not go further without saying that we could not have had such excellent programming without the invaluable assistance of **Tanya Putman.** She is on her way to sainthood. Thank you, Tanya!

### Faith Formation:

Here are creative ways the *seeds of faith* were cultivated in 2023:

- We have spent over **156 hours of inperson activities**, social gatherings, and Sunday School while making sure to stay responsible. Despite a few challenges, we have managed to stay connected with each other and even had a few consistent visitors throughout the year.
- Our "out of door" activities have been a hit, with body prayer being a class favorite, as well as playing games like cut-throat Harry Potter UNO and I-Spy Jesus. We have also engaged in random craft activities, made prayer beads, renamed turtles, and purchased goods for a food pantry. All of these activities have helped us build relationships while putting into action messages of care for one another, our faith, and justice.
- We enjoyed a "low waste" Easter for the youth & and children. Instead of plastic eggs, we purchased felted eggs/hearts from a fiber artist. Instead of an egg hunt, we set up a



scavenger hunt for all. Everyone made Easter crowns and enjoyed our "petting zoo" turtle friends who visited. Much fun was had by all.

- After a few years of hiatus, and with Giuseppe's support, musical direction from Niki and Guitar Friends, and participation from our youth & friends, a wonderfully magical and meaningful **Christmas Eve Service** was presented. Thank you to Sharon Ericson and Tanya for assisting as needed.
- Thank you to Niki, Mike & Jesse for sharing your musical talents.

Thank you to the Children and youth for being "sheep" reading, lighting candles, and carrying in the puppets/ star; and Pastor Giuseppe for tying it together with an inspired blessing. It was a most amazing service!

Looking into our 2024 Youth Programs... I have been introduced to organizers from **NE Portland Youth Collective** and look forward to establishing a relationship with them and getting our youth involved in shared activities/ projects.

<u>Fellowship</u>: This group of youth, along with their families and friends, enjoy spending time together and having fun. Additionally, we aim to organize events that bring people of all ages together, fostering friendships and connections within our church community. This past year, the **Youth & Families Group** was to carry out the following activities:

In 2023, we:

- Welcomed **1 new junior Youth Member and 1 new Sr. Youth.** As well as welcomed Pastor Giuseppe and his family.
- One of our long-time Youth members graduated high school and occasionally visits and joins in the fun!
- We had fun at the **"Secrets of Nibiru" Escape Room** and enjoyed pottery painting at **Mimosa Pottery Studio**.
- Our Easter Sunday Breakfast raised over \$400 for the youth fund.
- We also had a Fall Fun Day on the Farm, went to Pizza & Wunderland Nickel Arcade-Tiki putt golf, and had a Thrifting & Food Cart Adventure.

### Youth Service to the community:



Our youth assisted in the collection of canned goods for the **Souper Bowl of Caring**. Our drive yielded **\$63.00** and **83 Ibs. of food & clothing** for **SnowCap Charities**. We took a tour, learning more about seeing eye / canine companion programs, and volunteered to help beautify a pollinator garden at the **Guide Dogs for the Blind** campus, for a total of **15 hours of volunteer service!** 

We have Amazing, Dedicated VOLUNTEERS! One of our youth and adults consistently volunteered on Monday evenings (Jan. through Aug), getting folks signed up for showers, providing supplies, and reheating meals for a **total of 210 service hours!** Thank you, Lea & Vicki!

<u>Community Life Leader Role:</u> A continuation of nurturing our partnership with our church, community, and WeShine.

As the fallout from living through a pandemic has demonstrated, the church has continued the good works to innovate and <u>redesign</u> how we connect as a church and serve our community's ever-changing needs.

Essential services were provided to the unhoused community in partnership with organizations like **Union Gospel Mission, Cultivate Initiatives, Portland Rescue Mission, and** 



**Outside In**. Communal pods were constructed in the WeShine Village, and weekly shower services were provided with UGM and Cultivate Initiatives. The shower services provided clothing, showers, and life care essentials to dozens of people in the community.

We had a full class- 20+ persons and 1 dog- for the **Personal Safety Workshop** with **Rose City Self-Defense** held in March, with great feedback. We plan for additional workshops in 2024. Look for more information on this.

### **Portland Fruit Tree Project &**

**PCUCC** A dozen PGE Impact volunteers came out in October and helped to harvest fruit and join in a painting project in the Parkrose Community village.



A few of us Parkrose UCCers Painted with **WeShine & Gather Make Shelter** painted several colorful and bright mandalas for the village art installation. These will eventually be installed on the village fencing.

Leven Land & Housing and Interfaith Movement for Immigrant Justice (IMIRJ) In the fall of 2023, this new collaboration was established in the fields of housing and immigrant justice. Parkrose UCC seeks to explore the path of becoming a Sacred Organizing Cohort and hopes to foster this connection to see where it leads in 2024.

Circles intersect in this field of work. Giuseppe and I have also been added to the **East County Ministry Alliance.** Again, another exciting group to work in partnership within 2024.

### Community Grants

We utilized funds from **1 Grant in 2023** to help continue service to the community...

 Utilized the funds from the East Portland Action Plan-Community Support Fund Grant (awarded in late 2022) – \$3000.00 for the Transitional Shelter Village Hygiene, Sanitation & Wash Services Program.

Our funding request was utilized in the following way(s):

- Assisted in primarily funding shower mobile services from Union Gospel Mission (UGM) for the first year. Monday evenings were the night for villagers and community members to come and shower, get needed hygiene supplies, and receive a meal.
- Shower services continued until communal pods were built. The project had numerous setbacks and was completed at the end of Summer

2023. UGM was flexible. Parkrose UCC and WeShine split the last bill when grant funds were exhausted.

• We celebrated this partnership with a BBQ with villagers, community, volunteers, and staff. Another step in building our village!

### WeShine's Parkrose Community

**Village** has positively impacted the Parkrose UCC community and created a safe transitional village and enhanced stability and safety for guests, neighbors, and partners. We've also established a volunteer network and good neighbor agreements with local businesses and community members. A 4-year lease was recently signed with WeShine as we are committed to this partnership and many of WeShine's grant funds were invested here in this micro-shelter project.

### Crafter's Bazaar & Fall Festival

Our Crafter's Bazaar & Fall Festival was held on October 7<sup>th</sup> and was a rather impressive event! We had participation with fantastic vendors, amazing community partners, and a community favorite, adorable BABY GOATS! A ginormous THANK YOU to those who helped plan the event, set up, and close the shop at the end of the day! Here are just a few fantastic outcomes!



- **Raised over \$1600.00 for the** church & her ministries.
- Shopped & and supported over 16 local, small businesses!
- (Several were first-time vendors!)
- Highlighted 5 awesome community partner organizations.
- We added FOOD and musical guests this year. Tamales sold out immediately. The music was enjoyed by attendees.
- We had 9 **Raffle Basket** Winners! A featured and favorite activity at the bazaar!

Our amazing Community Partners include SnowCap, Simple Sundries, City Nature, Cultivate Initiatives, and WeShine!

### American Red Cross Blood Drives:

PCUCC held 4 blood drives this year with the American Red Cross. These quarterly drives helped boost the community's blood supply and provide lifesaving blood to hospital patients. Over the 4 blood drives in 2023, **we have collected 194 + units!!!**

# 2023 Investment Team Report

The Investment Team was established on February 14, 2010 by the Church Council. Investments with Scheller Financial Services and United Church Funds are currently being overseen by Blair Loudat. An Investment Policy was also created in 2010 by the original Investment Team and approved by the Church Council as a guide for investing. The Policy Statement reads:

"The stewardship responsibilities associated with the investment of Parkrose Community United Church of Christ investment funds are to be discharged in such a manner as to maximize the return on investments while also considering such factors as the preservation and safety of capital and prudent diversification of funds that are socially responsible."

The Church currently has three investment accounts – one with Scheller Financial Services and two with United Church Funds. At the December Congregational Meeting, the restriction for congregational approval for use of the Endowment Fund was lifted.

### Wygant Property Funds

The funds from the sale of the Wygant property are invested with Scheller Financial Services. The account began the year with a balance of \$177.303 and ended with 193,342. Accounting for \$10,000 in withdrawals for operating cost, the gain is actually **\$16,039**.

### **Endowment Fund**

The Endowment Fund is with the United Church Funds, which is associated with the United Church of Christ. Investments in the United Church Fund



are in the stock market. The interest accrued each quarter is sent to the church and becomes income in our budget. For 2023, the interest income was \$2695. As of December 31, 2022, the fund had a book value of \$87,658 and a market value of \$143,827. As of December 31, 2023, while the book value remained at \$87,658, the market value had increased to \$167,579 for an overall gain of **\$23,752**. No funds were withdrawn from this account during 2023 other than interest income.

Our Special Outreach Fund, also with United Church Funds, began the year with a book value for this investment of \$313,054 and the market value of \$337,363. The year ended with a book value of \$245,652 and a market value of \$267,444. It is important to note that over the course of the year, \$90,000 has been withdrawn for operating expenses. The overall loss for this account including withdrawals is **\$69,919**.


